A Year in Review

2021 ends with trust in science and scientists on the rise worldwide according to the <u>latest results</u> of the Wellcome Trust Global Monitor. The results indicate one more time that the claim that trust in science is declining in an alleged "post-truth era" is not an accurate depiction of reality.

Yet, the big picture is more complex. There is evidence of a breakdown of trust in specific policy areas. Climate action continues to be slow despite repetitive warnings from scientists. As Covid-19 resists being tamed, vaccine hesitancy prolongs the end of the pandemic. Many see the spread of science disinformation as a disruption of our mechanisms to achieve common knowledge and common ground.

Over the past months, the PERITIA team has geared its research and activities towards addressing these scenarios of contested expertise influencing policy matters. In the last newsletter of the year, we take a step back and select 10 highlights of the project in 2021 to build a more comprehensive understanding on the prospects of trust in science for 2022.
